- 2. Provide whole process support to vulnerable families making claims for Carers Allowance, DLA and PIP
- 3. Advising and supporting parent-carers in preparing for appeals and tribunals
- 4. Provide face to face advice to parent-carers at a monthly Benefits Advice Roadshow
- 5. Work with the Benefits Support Worker on reviewing claim checks
- 6. Work with the team on the research, writing and editing of a new Benefits Toolkit
- 7. Work with team in editing and updating other resources including our parent-carer guide, Making Sense of It All
- 8. Carry out regular monitoring and evaluation and provide written progress reports on service delivery for the Director, Trustees and Funders
- 9. Represent the project and Reaching Families at relevant external meetings with other local providers
- 10. Assist the Director in making funding applications to ensure the ongoing sustainability and development of the service
- 11. To carry out other occasional duties commensurate with the role
